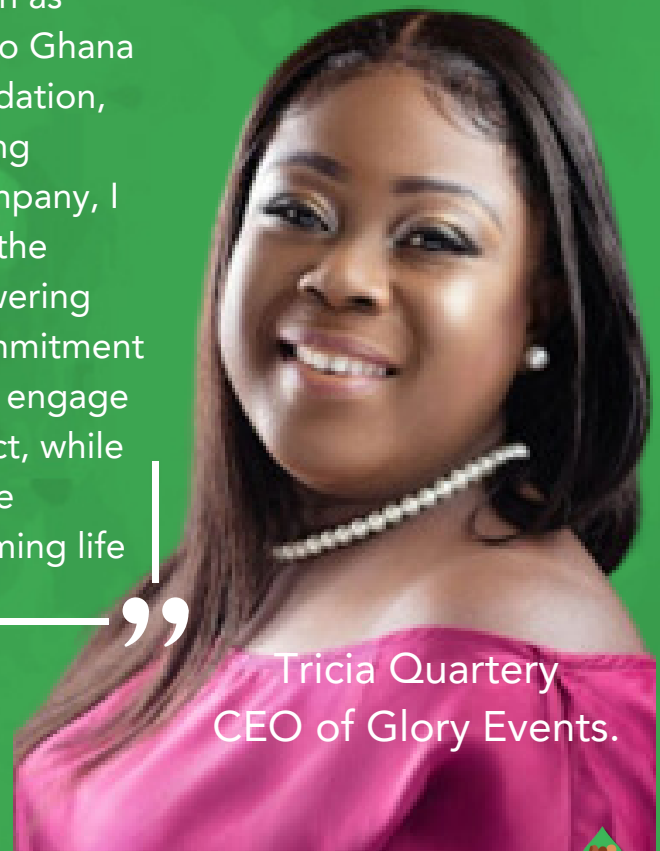

ADULT PROGRAMS

- **Engagement Works**

- Working with employers and refugees, Engagement Works bridges the gap to meet the needs of employers while meeting the training needs of New Americans. The program partners with businesses to create customized workplace training programs for immigrant and refugee employees.

- **Education, Employment, Empowerment**

- Provides services ranging from case management to ESOL and employability support efforts.
 - **RIDA**
 - Promotes economic independence and financial responsibility by providing incentives for saving behaviors for New Americans.
 - **Micro Business Training and Technical Assistance**
 - A training program in conjunction with partners to provide small business training and technical assistance for New Americans who want to learn how to start a business.

- **Community Health & Wellness**

- Seeks to address the behavioral and mental health needs of Central Ohio's culturally and linguistically diverse communities.
- Provides outreach and referral for community health needs, food insecurity, rent, COVID-19 resources and information, and other categories of needed resources.
- Offers trauma-informed in-person counseling services that are designed to address the unique mental health needs of individuals within the Refugee, Immigrant, and New American communities.

- **Family Care**

- Aims to raise awareness, educate, empower, and provide the needed resources when domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking or stalking occurs.
- The Sole Shop provides clothing, hygiene, and household items for families in Family Care programming.

- **OhioKAN**

- Flexible and responsive kinship and adoption navigator program designed to support children, youth, and their families.

RESETTLEMENT

- Housing assistance- Our program assists refugees in finding safe and affordable housing, offering guidance on lease agreements.
- Cultural Orientation: We provide cultural orientation sessions to help refugees understand American customs, laws, and expectations, as well as familiarize them with local services and amenities.
- Employment Support: Through job readiness training, resume building and job placement assistance, we help refugees navigate the job market and secure employment opportunities.
- Language and Educational Services: We offer English language classes, educational support for children, and access to vocational training programs to enhance skills and knowledge.
- Community Integration: ETSS organizes community events, volunteer opportunities, and cultural exchange programs to foster connections between refugees and the broader Columbus community.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

- **Afterschool Program**
 - Serves youth in grades K-8, providing academic support with a focus on math and literacy, social-emotional learning, health and wellness, cultural enrichment, and professional development.
- **Healthy Transitions & Reach Higher**
 - Provides services to 14-18-year-olds.
 - Services include referral for academic tutoring, assistance with high school planning, and career exploration.
- **Summer Youth Enrichment (SYEP)**
 - Structured and engaging program that prevents summer learning loss and supports youths continued growth and development.
- **Family, School, and Community Engagement Program.**
 - Acts as a liaison between school districts, families, and their communities.
- **Achieve More and Prosper (AMP)**
 - Helps youth ages 16-18 build a customized plan for their future while addressing their current challenges. The program connects youth with services and assistance to help gain real world employment skills.



Highlighting Community Outreach

Revolutionizing Community Outreach: Neybe's WhatsApp Initiative Connects Spanish Speakers in Franklin County

Neybe's devotion to serving her community as a Community Healthcare Worker took on a new dimension in 2023 as she harnessed the power of technology to bridge gaps in access to healthcare. She understood the potential of leveraging social media to deliver crucial resources to those most in need.

Originally a Crisis Counselor at ETSS, Neybe's transition to Community Healthcare Worker was a natural progression in her mission to assist the communities she served. She recognized the need for tailored outreach to Spanish-speaking communities and devised an approach that would be effective while still meeting their linguistic needs.

Drawing upon the popularity of WhatsApp, a widely used messaging app in Spanish-speaking regions, Neybe created dedicated groups to connect residents with essential services. Requiring only Wi-Fi, WhatsApp made it an ideal platform to reach Spanish-speaking communities.

Neybe's initiative quickly gained momentum, with the original group expanding into multiple subgroups covering various topics, from jobs to healthcare. The nature of the groups ensured that members received important information customized to their specific needs, nurturing a feeling of engagement, community, and solidarity.

Neybe's impactful efforts have led to over 4,000 Franklin County residents receiving crucial outreach in June 2023. Her compassionate advocacy and dedication to providing culturally and linguistically appropriate education have earned praise.

Neybe's WhatsApp initiative serves as a prime example of the transformative power of community-driven interventions in tackling health inequalities and uplifting marginalized populations.



Community Garden

Under the guidance of mentors, volunteers, and staff, ETSS youth tilled, planted, and tended to the garden at our westside location. 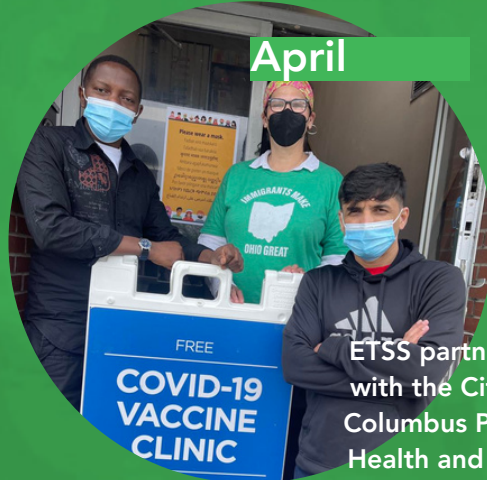

Resettlement Success Story

From Combat to Contribution: A Journey of Service
